NBCRC Pilot Grant

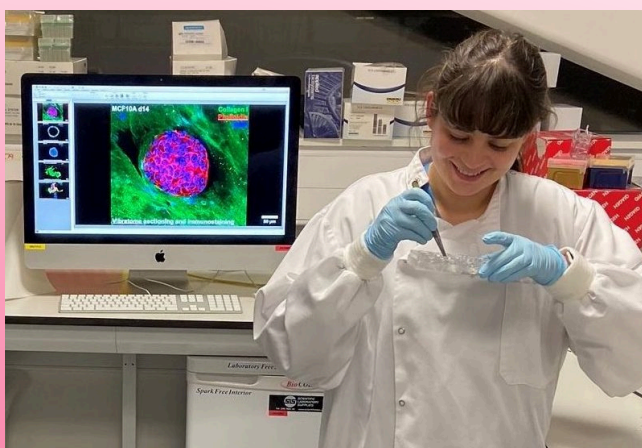
Our Pilot Grant Scheme has this far supported 11 breast cancer research projects since launching in 2019. We fund promising early-stage research to generate preliminary data for publications and larger external funding applications. During the projects researchers provide progress reports every 3-4 months in accessible language, which we share with our supporters and community. We also follow-up following completion of the project to let you know the impact the work has had. The scheme also encourages new research teams to collaborate with NBCRC members, expanding our breast cancer research community.

The deadline for the 2025 round of applications is Monday 24th March 2025, midday.

Pilot Grant Spotlight - Dr Jennifer Ashworth

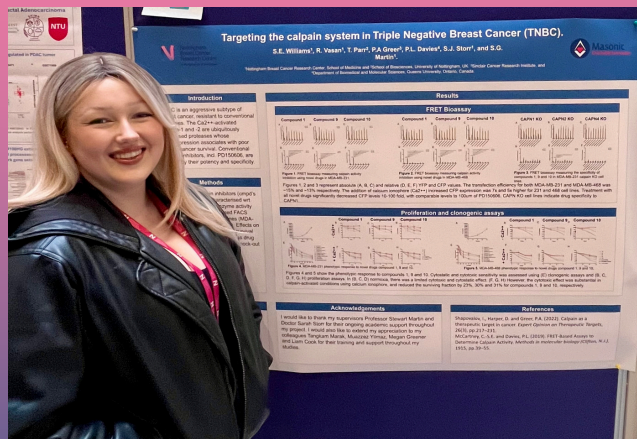

The Cancer Research Nottingham (CRN) Symposium took place on January 24th, bringing together our entire cancer research community with many NBCRC PhD students presenting their work. Well done to all that presented – there is some amazing work going on! One poster presented was by Masonic Charitable Foundation (MCF) funded student, Sophie Williams, who is working on a family of proteins called calpains, with NBCRC member Stewart Martin and Sarah Storr, characterising novel drugs to stop breast

cancer spread and improve therapy response. As with all our PhD student presenters, the data generated a lot of useful discussions.

NBCRC Committee Member Professor Kwok-Leung Cheung, Professor of Breast Surgery and Medical Education, one of our management committee members, has recently been elected as the **President-Elect of the International Society of Geriatric Oncology (SIOG)** for 2024 – 2026 following which he will become the President for 2026 – 2028. **SIOG** is a multidisciplinary membership-based society with members engaged in more than 80 countries around the world. Breast cancer and geriatric oncology are Professor Cheung's clinical and research interests he has a mission to improve the care of older adults with cancer.
