




What is University Detectives?

University Detectives is a programme exclusively delivered to Year 2 pupils in our target schools. It challenges them to use their detective skills to find out more about what university is and why people may go there.

It is offered in three parts: an introduction; a campus visit; and a reflection session. The introduction and reflection sessions are delivered by Outreach Officers in-school, whilst the campus visit allows them to explore our University Park campus with the support of our Outreach Officers and Student Ambassadors.



^{*}Unique pupils is calculated based on how many pupils attended the campus visit element of University Detectives.



How is University Detectives evaluated?

During our introduction and reflection sessions, Year 2 pupils are provided with an evaluation form and asked to circle the labelled images that correctly represent university.

We utilise a guide created to highlight the different **Features and Benefits of university (FaBs)** and the form contains images that are associated with each of these FaBs, along with two that are incorrect. An average score is then calculated for each correctly identified FaB.



Analysis

Comparing the frequency of each individual image from the introduction session to the reflection session, we can see an increase in pupils' identification of all images related to **learning**, **university life and future prospects**, and a decrease in the two images which are incorrect and do not relate to a FaB.

In both the introduction and reflection sessions, pupils are asked to raise their hands if they think they might want to go to university in the future.


