## Respecting Property

- Report maintenance issues as soon as they arise, provide detailed information and photos to your landlord.
- Ensure both you and your guests comply with lease terms.
- Keep the property clean, create a monthly/weekly cleaning schedule. Assign tasks to specific days or roommates.

## Parking Consideration

- If a permit is required to park at your address there will be signs located at all entry points. You can get this online.
- It is important to park legally and considerately, this means respecting driveway entrances and avoiding taking up multiple spaces.
- Consider alternative options such as carpooling, public transport, or cycling.
