The various awards within an institution are distinguished by differences in both gown colour and in the shape and lining of the hood.

When hoods were worn to cover the head, their linings were of considerable practical importance with wool and fur used in the colder months and silk in the warmer ones. Much less interest was taken in colour, other than some colours being prohibited. In present times, the colours of hoods and their bindings are expressly used to distinguish between different levels and subject area of awards. These colours and styles vary from institution to institution. Since its foundation as a university in 1948, Nottingham has used light blue as its degree colour.

Gowns

Gowns for first degrees (eg BA, BSc, BMedSci, BArch, MSci) and masters degrees (eg MA, MSc, MRes) are black.

Gowns for doctors (eg PhD, EdD, NursD) are claret, faced to a depth of 3" with light blue silk.

Gowns for higher doctors (eg DD, DSc, LLD) are scarlet, faced to a depth of 3" with light blue silk.

Hoods

Certificate students wear a hood in the Belfast shape, diploma students in the Edinburgh shape. Both are lined and faced in (for undergraduate level) light blue or (for postgraduate level) dark green.

Degree students at all levels wear a hood in the Cambridge shape.

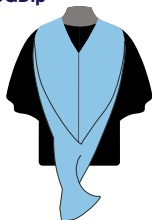
For first degrees and masters degrees hoods are black and lined with light blue silk to differing extents depending on the level of the award.

Hoods for doctors are claret and lined throughout with light blue silk.

Hoods for higher doctors are scarlet and lined throughout with light blue silk.

All graduate hoods are bound at the edge with a ribbon of the colour appropriate to the nominal faculty. For higher first and higher masters degrees, the entire hood – including the cape, is bound with ribbon. **See table on opposite page for details.**

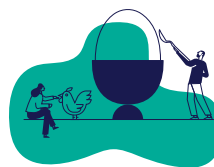

Recent Graduate Award

Madeline Pizzoni
(Nursing, 2013)

Madeline is a Captain in the British Army Air Corps. Joining the Army after graduation, Madeline completed her officer training at Sandhurst in 2015 before training to become a pilot. Completing her Wildcat training in 2019, Madeline advanced to front line 659 Squadron in December 2019, one of only a handful of active female pilots in the Army Air Corps. In addition to her work with her squadron, as part of the Covid Support Force, Madeline took part in a flypast with the Army Air Corps to mark Captain Sir Tom Moore's 100th birthday.



Recent Graduate Award

Olivia Swift
(Midwifery, 2015)

Olivia is the founder of Lotus Maternity, an award-winning maternity brand which provides products and services to support mums as they navigate parenthood. After training as a midwife and seeing the challenges faced by new mums, especially breastfeeding in public, Olivia was inspired to start her own business. During the pandemic, in addition to the support offered through her business, Olivia returned to midwifery on Nottingham's maternity wards to help during the crisis.



Special Excellence Award

Steve Cliffe
(Electrical Engineering, 1985)

Steve is an entrepreneur, CEO, and business advisor, with over 30 years' experience in the technology industry including senior roles at leading companies including Plessey, Dialog Semiconductor and Nanotech. Most recently he was the CEO and President of Ultraleap, an innovative technology company which brings together 3D hand tracking with haptic technology to be able to create the sensation of touch in mid-air, and now serves as chairman for a number of leading technology companies.



Special Excellence Award

Richard Wardlaw OBE
(Production Engineering, 1991)

Richard is a Lieutenant General in the British Army and holds the appointment of Chief of Defence Logistics and Support, placing him among the most senior soldiers in the Army. Joining the Army after graduation, Richard's 31 years of service has included tours across the world in Hong Kong, Brunei, the Falkland Islands, Germany and operationally in Northern Ireland, Bosnia, Iraq and Afghanistan. In 2007 and 2009, he was awarded the Queen's Commendation for Valuable Service (QCVS) following his tours of Iraq and Afghanistan and in 2011 he was awarded an OBE.



Special Excellence Award

Anmarie Spaziano
(Sociology, 2002)

Anmarie is the founder and owner of Annie's Burger Shack, one of the most popular restaurants in Nottingham. Annie's Burger Shack began when Anmarie, a native of Rhode Island, took over use of a little kitchen in the back of a rock 'n' roll pub with just a bum-bag and a frying pan. People fell in love with her tasty cooked-to-order burgers, and after moving to The Navigation Inn, queues would form with up to a three hour wait for food. In 2014 the first independent Annie's Burger Shack restaurant opened in the Lace Market, where it remains one of Nottingham's most-visited eateries.



Lifetime Achievement Award

Professor Sir Jonathan Van-Tam MBE (Medicine, 1985)

Jonathan is the Pro-Vice-Chancellor for the Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences and formerly Deputy Chief Medical Officer for England. Globally recognised as an expert on respiratory viruses, Jonathan was one of the most senior advisors to the government during the pandemic and has regularly presented at the government's national briefings. Jonathan's career spans across academia, the pharmaceutical industry and the public sector, including roles as Head of the Pandemic Influenza Office and Chair of the European Centre for Diseases Prevention and Control, and serving on the UK Scientific Advisory Group for Emergencies (SAGE).

The University of Nottingham, in common with other British universities, is empowered to give honorary degrees to people of distinction and those who have given great success to the university.



Sir Peter Rubin

Sir Peter Rubin was Chair of the General Medical Council (GMC) from 2009–2014. He was a consultant physician and professor of therapeutics

at the University of Nottingham from 1987–2014. His research focused on medical problems that may occur in pregnancy and their safe treatment.

Sir Peter has chaired a number of committees devoted to medical education, such as the GMC's Education Committee from 2002 to 2008, and the Postgraduate

Medical Education and Training Board. He served as a board member of the Higher Education Funding Council for England from 2003–2009, and co-chaired one of their committees that recommended the establishment of a new dental school in the South West of the country.

He was dean of the Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences at the University of Nottingham between 1997 and 2003. During this time, he led the development of both the University's Graduate Entry Medical School and the School of Veterinary Medicine and Science.

He was Knighted for services to medicine in 2010.

Sir Peter Rubin will receive the honorary Degree of Doctor of Medicine on Saturday 23 July 2022.



Professor Sir Jonathan Van-Tam MBE

Medicine, 1987

After graduating in medicine from the

University of Nottingham in 1987, Professor Sir Jonathan Van-Tam MBE spent five years practising hospital-based clinical medicine before becoming a senior lecturer at the University of Nottingham and regional epidemiologist for the Public Health Laboratory Service in 1997. He then spent four years working in the pharmaceutical and vaccines industries including senior roles at SmithKline Beecham, Roche Products and Sanofi-Pasteur MSD 2002 to 2004.

In 2004, Professor Sir Jonathan Van-Tam MBE was appointed Consultant Epidemiologist and Head of the Pandemic Influenza Office at the UK Health Protection Agency in 2004, before becoming Deputy Chief Medical Officer (DCMO) in October 2017 where he advised the Westminster government on public health protection alongside roles on the UK Scientific Advisory Group for Emergencies (SAGE) and Chair of the UK New and Emerging Respiratory Virus Threat Advisory Group (NERVTAG).

Professor Sir Jonathan Van-Tam MBE's work as DCMO ensured he became a household name during the Covid-19 pandemic, regularly presenting at the televised Downing Street briefings to an audience of millions. It is during these briefings that he caught the public imagination for his range of creative analogies to explain complex public health issues, earning him the affectionate nickname "JVT" and a knighthood in the 2022 New Year Honours.

Having published more than 100 scientific papers and written four textbooks over his extensive career, Professor Sir Jonathan Van-Tam MBE has now returned to the University of Nottingham to become our new Pro-Vice-Chancellor for Medicine and Health Sciences.

We are delighted to welcome JVT back to Nottingham and bestow the degree of Doctor of Laws, honoris causa, in recognition of his achievements, on Saturday 23 July 2022.



The Right Reverend Dr Alastair Redfern

The Right Reverend Dr Alastair is an assistant

Bishop in the diocese of Bath And Wells, and was Bishop of Derby from 2005 to 2018. He became the Lord Bishop of Derby in 2010 and took up his seat in the House of Lords. During that time, he served on the Parliamentary Joint Committee on Modern Slavery which helped to craft the Modern Slavery Act 2015.

Outside of his parliamentary career, Dr Redfern is deeply committed to ending modern slavery and is a founding member of the Derby and Derbyshire Modern Slavery Partnership. Working with The Clewer Sisters (a community of Anglican nuns), he founded the Clewer Initiative in 2018 – a national project working with churches and other faith organisations to tackle modern slavery.

He has also been Chair of the Independent Anti-Slavery Commissioner's Advisory Panel and represents the Church of England on the Global Sustainability Network, who work towards fulfilling Global Sustainability Goal 8.7: the eradication of slavery.

Dr Redfern will receive the honorary Degree of Doctor of Laws on Thursday 28 July 2022.



Professor Maria-Jose Alonso

Professor Maria-Jose Alonso is one of the world's leading researchers in pharmaceutical science

and has helped develop new delivery nanotechnologies for the treatment and prevention of various diseases, including cancer, diabetes, ocular and infectious diseases.

Professor Alonso has translated her science to numerous companies for commercial and clinical benefit and has spun-out technology into three companies. She has been a Governor, Secretary and President of the Controlled Release Society, and received multiple major awards for her work, i.e. the National Research Award, and been elected to membership of prestigious scientific societies, including the Spanish Royal Academy of Pharmacy, The Royal Academy of Medicine of Belgium and the US National Academy of Medicine, the American Institute for Medical and Biological Engineering's College of Fellows, and the College of Fellows of the Controlled Release Society.

She has also been an exceptional advocate for pharmaceutical science research and for women in STEM globally, leading, by example, the Women in Sciences Group of the Controlled Release Society.

Professor Alonso will receive the honorary Degree of Doctor of Science on Thursday 28 July 2022.



Major Sally Orange

**Physiotherapy,
2000**

Major (Retd) Sally Orange is a physiotherapist, endurance athlete and award-winning

mental health campaigner, who has dedicated the last 30 years to volunteering and fundraising for over 40 different charities, raising over £500,000.

Her career started in the NHS, before joining the Royal Army Medical Corps, where she completed 22 years exemplary service rehabilitating injured service personnel. This included an operational tour of duty in Afghanistan.

She has also volunteered as a physiotherapist at numerous international sporting events, including the London 2012 Paralympic Games, 2014 Commonwealth Games and 2017 World Para Athletics Championships and also at the London NHS Nightingale Hospital during the pandemic.

Sally holds multiple Guinness world records, has run over 70 marathons and is an Invictus Games medallist. She captained the first British female injured and sick team to complete the relentless Race Across America, the world's toughest cycle race and has completed the toughest footrace on earth, the Marathon des Sables. This is in addition to both swimming and rowing across the English Channel. She is the only person on the planet to complete a marathon on every continent in fancy dress...as different pieces of fruit!

Sally reports that "by taking on physical challenges, often dressed as different pieces of fruit, I find that people smile and ask why? When I tell them I am passionate about breaking down the stigma associated with mental illness, they often open up and talk about how either they or someone they know has, or is currently struggling with their mental health. It subtly starts a conversation, while also proving you don't have to be the fastest or the fittest to gain a sense of achievement in a positive environment."

Sally will receive the honorary Degree of Doctor of Laws on Monday 1 August 2022.



Dr Richard Henshell OBE

Mechanical Engineering, 1964

Dr Richard Henshell is an alumni and honorary professor at the University

of Nottingham and a Nottinghamshire business man, with interests in engineering and science software, start-up companies and conservation, particularly building energy and restoration.

He arrived at the university in January 1960 to take an open scholarship in maths but was advised to take a gap year in the engineering industry, including a period in Germany.

In 1963 he spent time in engineering in Sweden. Hence two of his five languages. After graduating with a First Class BSc Honours and a Marsden Prize in Mechanical Engineering in 1964, Dr Henshell began his career as a research fellow at the university and later became a lecturer.

With colleagues at Nottingham, he founded the PAFEC (Program for Automatic Finite Element Calculations) suite of Finite Element programs.

In 1976, they formed PAFEC Ltd to commercialise the computer software, which could instantly calculate stresses and the strength of engineering components for engineers, pioneering the industrial use of finite element analysis, which is still the industry standard today. The achievement was recognised in 1989 with an OBE and in 1990 with election to the Royal Academy of Engineering.

Dr Henshell will receive the honorary Degree of Doctor of Engineering on 1 August 2022.

While still working full time, this will be one day before his 80th birthday.



Professor Barry Stickings CBE

Professor Barry Stickings CBE has had an illustrious career within the global chemicals industry

and is a strong advocate for the university. He has made an outstanding contribution to entrepreneurship and economic growth in the UK as President of the Chemical Industry Association, Chair of the Chemicals Innovation and Growth Team, and serving on government and industry boards and advisory panels.

In Nottingham, Professor Stickings helped initiate and was Founding Chair of BioCity Nottingham and helped it become one of the largest bioscience incubators in Europe. He was Chair of Innovation East Midlands, the regional science council.

At the university, Professor Stickings was Chair of the Chemistry Strategic Advisory Board helping to advise and mentor staff and students over many years, and assisting with strategy development, new teaching innovations and building important connections with industry. He has also supported the commercialisation of university intellectual property and helped establish and chaired Promethean Particles, based on technology jointly developed by Chemistry and Engineering.

Professor Stickings will receive the honorary Degree of Doctor of Science on Tuesday 2 August 2022.



Andrew Lambirth

Art History with History, 1980

Andrew Lambirth is a writer, critic and curator

specialising in the field of modern British art, who graduated from the University of Nottingham with a degree in Art History with History in 1980.

He has written on art for a number of publications including *The Sunday Telegraph*, *The Spectator*, *The Sunday Times*, *Modern Painters*, *The Art Newspaper* and *RA*, the Royal Academy magazine. Among his many books are monographs on Craigie Aitchison, Roger Hilton, Maggi Hambling, John Hoyland, Margaret Mellis, Allen Jones, L. S. Lowry and R. B. Kitaj. He was art critic for *The Spectator* (2002–2014) and his reviews have been collected in a paperback entitled *A is a Critic*. He recently published a monograph on artist John Nash and a book on influential curator of the Whitechapel Art Gallery, Bryan Robertson. Lambirth has curated exhibitions of work by Eileen Agar, Peter Blake, Maggi Hambling, Roger Hilton, Cedric Morris and Ivon Hitchens for various museums and public galleries. A selection of portraits from his own collection was shown at Gainsborough House Museum in 2016.

Andrew will receive the honorary Degree of Doctor of Letters on Wednesday 3 August 2022.



Vicky McClure

BAFTA Award winning actor Vicky McClure is best known for her roles as Detective Inspector Kate Fleming in the BBC

series *Line of Duty* and Lol Jenkins in the film *This Is England* and its sequel mini-series on Channel 4.

Vicky grew up in Wollaton, Nottingham, taking dance lessons from the age of three, and went on to earn a place at an acting school aged 11, learning her craft at the Nottingham TV Workshop.

In 2018, she joined forces with University of Nottingham academics, filming the documentary *Our Dementia Choir* with Vicky McClure. It was Vicky's close personal experience of dementia, through caring for her Nana Iris, and through her role with the Alzheimer's Society, where she saw first-hand how music and singing had affected dementia patients. The documentary demonstrated how music can stimulate a brain damaged by dementia and left a lasting legacy in our understanding of how music therapy can help people with dementia.

Vicky will receive the honorary Degree of Doctor of Letters on Tuesday 9 August 2022.



Bill Bryson OBE

Award-winning non-fiction author Bill Bryson OBE was born in Des Moines, Iowa, but

is a self-confessed Anglophile, having spent most of his adult life in the UK. He is renowned for his global best-selling, unconventional travel and science books, including *The Body: A Guide for Occupants* (2019), part of which is based on research undertaken in the dissection room in the University of Nottingham's Medical School. It went on to be shortlisted for the British Book Awards 2020.

Bill is committed to environmental protection and is a commissioner for English Heritage and was president of the Campaign to Protect Rural England (2007–2012). He was Chancellor of Durham University (2005–2011) and is the first non-Brit to be made an Honorary Fellow of the Royal Society. In 2019, he delivered a Vice-Chancellor's lecture at Nottingham.

Bill will receive the honorary Degree of Doctor of Letters on Thursday 11 August 2022.
