

Accessibility

University campuses are accessible to the public and provide disabled parking (Blue Badge) and disabled toilet (RADAR) facilities. The campuses have many fully accessible pathways. Please note that not all events start or finish adjacent to accessible facilities. If you are participating in one of our outdoor events, please be aware that there will be a degree of walking on uneven or undulating grassed/wooded areas – which may or may not be suitable for wheelchair/mobility scooter use or difficult for visually impaired. Please expect to travel distances of 1-3 miles on some of the walking events – most with resting places. The indoor 'lecture style' events are fully accessible with indoor facilities, ramped access and parking close by.

Bat Walk

The trees around the Highfields Lake are a good habitat for bats and offer a great chance to watch them closely. A thermal camera may be set up so that people can watch the Daubenton's bats. As a bonus option, the walk may extend to include moth trapping and hence people can capture moths in jars to look at before they are released. All equipment will be provided.
