Infrastructure Update

The Green Chemicals Research Beacon is being incorporated into the Department of Chemical and Environmental Engineering. Building work in L3 to upgrade some of the laboratories will take place over the summer.

As part of the Beacon, industrial biotechnology equipment will be developed, and technicians, students and researchers will work together on novel research to engineer sustainable processes using emerging technologies.


Funding covers travel, subsistence and accommodation to facilitate the placements /visits. Funds to cover additional caring costs incurred by participation in the programme are also available.
