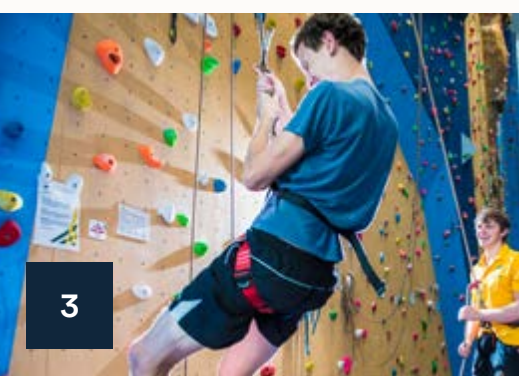
There are lots of things to do during the open day.
