Parking

Travelling to Nottingham



By train

- For **University Park and Jubilee Campuses**, book a train to Nottingham railway station.
- For **Sutton Bonington Campus**, book a train to Loughborough railway station.

Staff and students in blue t-shirts will be at both train stations, to direct you towards the free shuttle buses to the campuses. See page 12 for times.

From Nottingham railway station, you can also take the Toton Lane tram to reach University Park South entrance.



Park and ride

The University area of the city is easy to reach using the Nottingham tram network and this can help you avoid traffic queues on the day. Toton Lane park and ride is close to the M1 and the tram runs directly to University Park Campus from there. Alight at 'University of Nottingham'.

Return tram travel costs just £2 with an 'event ticket' – choose this option when buying your tickets at the tram stop, and have your open day booking confirmation as proof that you will be attending this event.

By car to University Park and Jubilee Campuses

Due to parking restrictions, all visitors to University Park and Jubilee Campuses should travel to University Park Campus.

Car parking

Free parking is available at University Park Campus only (blue badge holders may park at Jubilee Campus). Jubilee Campus is very close to University Park Campus – free shuttle buses run between these two campuses all day. When you arrive on campus, security staff will direct you to the nearest available parking.

A hop-on hop-off bus runs in a loop around University Park Campus on open days, approximately every 15 minutes.







On University Park Campus, the Portland Building is home to the University of Nottingham Students' Union. Following a £15m ongoing development project, it now offers bright, inspiring places to work, new shops and Portland Coffee Co.

The Djanogly Terrace was completed in February 2018 and provides students, staff and visitors with an extensive, modern, outdoor multi-functional space available for performances, exhibitions, displays and concerts.

The Teaching and Learning Building, positioned adjacent to Hallward Library provides unique and versatile teaching spaces, including teaching rooms, performing arts spaces and a social learning hub.

Opened in 2016 and generously supported by Nottingham Law alumnus and Carphone Warehouse founder David Ross, the David Ross Sports Village is a sector-leading inspirational

venue. Students get priority access to an incredible range of international-standard facilities and the latest in fitness technology.

This month, the University will be opening an outstanding new health centre set within a landscaped area. The centre, made possible thanks to a transformational gift from the Cripps Foundation, expands the range of facilities on campus supported by alumni and friends who share our vision of an outstanding student experience for all at Nottingham.

On Jubilee Campus, you will find the impressive GlaxoSmithKline Carbon Neutral Laboratory for Sustainable Chemistry and the new Institute of Advanced Manufacturing Building, which opened in late 2017. The Research Acceleration and Demonstration (RAD) Building is currently under development.
